

- ✓ Insecurity and lack of trust in Aus government
- ✓ Rule of Law
- ✓ Education is Australia's third largest export industry it is a key industry of the future in world economies

- ✓ Reality of international students in Australia
- ✓ Many students are young and highly skilled 25,000 PR places 2013-14
- ✓ Don't chuck out the baby with the bathwater







# Changes – what do they mean?

- ✓ Not just rebranding
- ✓ Clear separation of temporary and permanent visas
- ✓ Aim to reduce number of permanent residence applications
- ✓ Sustainable population









# Productivity Commission Inquiry Report

- ✓ Released to gov 13 April 2016, to public 12 Sept 2016
- √700 page report, notable points below
- ✓ Younger and more highly skilled workers required
- ✓ Age limit recommended to be reduced
- ✓ One list for all PR applications and points test for all visas
- ✓ Half PR visas went to those on uncapped temporary programs
- ✓ Immigration policy recognised as population policy
- ✓ Governments not competent in infrastructure planning
- ✓ Regional migration recommended if sound planning conducted







# Changes in brief announced Apr 17

- √457 to be abolished, new TSS
- ✓ By Mar 18 visa holders will need two years of full-time work experience impact for students
- ✓ New lists STSOL and MLTSSL
- ✓ Occupation lists to change every 6 months
- ✓ ENS 186 MLTSSL only after Mar 18









# **Changes cont**

- ✓ Citizenship English test and 4 years PR
- ✓RSMS 187 Mar 18 3 years experience MLTSSL and new regional occupations
- ✓ Age limit reduced to 45 rather than 50
- √ 10 visas sub-classes and Al
- ✓ Reversal of 2012 demand driven philosophy







# Implications for students

- ✓ See tables
- ✓ States may play an important role whilst being mindful of infrastructure costs
- ✓ Lobbying by industry bodies to states
- ✓ 18 month 485 visa will deprive students of ability to gain 2 years work experience for TSS











#### **Hospitality pre March 2018**








#### **Hospitality post March 2018**









- ✓ Long term pipeline effects








# Sledgehammer approach

- ✓ Consultation with education agents beneficial










#### **Solutions**
